

Gary Dungan is a highly successful accountant who led audit teams as a Senior Accountant with KPMG and served at the Senior Vice President level of two of the nation's 100 largest bank holding companies. Due to his expertise, the Federal Reserve Board sought out Gary to help resolve the Savings & Loan Crisis during the late 1980's and 1990's by serving with the Resolution Trust Corporation, a temporary government agency established by Congress to resolve the crisis.

Gary is a graduate of the University of Virginia with a BS degree in commerce with an emphasis in accounting. Upon graduation, he secured his first professional job as a CPA with KPMG, the world's largest Management Consulting and Certified Public Accounting firm (then known as Peat, Marwick, Mitchell & Company).

Having gained professional experience as well as the respect of his clients and peers, Gary later accepted a position with First Virginia Bank of Falls Church as their regional audit manager in Roanoke, and was quickly promoted to Assistant General Auditor, then to General Auditor with responsibility for auditing, security, loan quality, and compliance with all Federal and state laws and regulations.

Gary later was recruited to be Senior Vice President by another of the nation's largest 100 bank holding companies, 1st Commerce Corporation in New Orleans, which was looking for people with expertise in putting together statewide banking organizations.

After successfully implementing procedural changes that positively impacted the world of banking and accounting, his expertise and experience was recognized by the Federal Reserve Board, which recruited him to work for the Resolution Trust Corporation. Gary served in Buffalo, New York as Managing Agent of the 12th largest Savings & Loan in the country, then as Supervisory Managing Agent over sixteen other Savings & Loans, and as Department Head of Investigations, looking into criminal activity that led to the failure of the Savings & Loans.

Gary was raised on a farm in Southwest Virginia and served in the U.S. Army as a military policeman. He and his wife, Anne Newcomer reside in her home town of Harpers Ferry and have two daughters, one granddaughter and are expecting a grandson in the very near future.

Gary is employed as the Business Manager of St. James Catholic Church in Charles Town and has served on numerous community and civic organizations. He is serving his third term as an appointed member the Jefferson County Development Authority.
